ELIGIBILITY & PERFORMANCE RULES

Competition events are open to any individual member of ISI whose membership is current up to and including the date of the competition. All competitors must compete at their highest test level passed and all tests must be registered with the ISI Headquarters at least 30 days prior to the competition date.

Members of USFS are eligibly and welcome to compete in ISI competitions as long as they are individual members of ISI and have all their ISI tests passed and registered. For requirements for the minimum ISI test level on which USFS skaters must compete, see the 2016 Edition of *The ISI Handbook*.

All ISI competitions are team competitions where skaters earn points for their home rink/team, and therefore all competitors must represent a current ISI Administrative Member Arena.

DESCRIPTIONS OF EVENTS AND PERFORMANCE RULES for all ISI events can be found in the 2016 edition of *The ISI Handbook*.

*******NEW 2016 ISI RULE REVISIONS WILL BE IN EFFECT!*******

There are significant rule revisions for Freestyle levels 2, 5, 6, 9, and other levels too. The uncaptured moves limitations for gliding maneuvers, jumps, and spins have been removed for the following events: Artistic, Couples, Couples Spotlight, Freestyle, Interpretive, Open Freestyle, Open Pair, Pair, Rhythmic, Solo Spotlight, Themed Spotlight, Freestyle Synchro, and Team Compulsories.

In all ISI program events, the skaters use music of their own choice. The host facility will provide music for Stroking, Ice Dancing, and Interpretive events.

The theme for this year's interpretive event is **Rock and Roll**. See 2016 edition of *The ISI Handbook* for further event descriptions and limitations.

All events will be held on full ice, except solo compulsories Pre-Alpha-FS 3 levels, and jump and spin. The interpretive event will be held on full ice, but may be doubled paneled.

**SOLO COMPULSORIES FEATURED-DISCOUNT EVENT \$5 AS ADDITIONAL
EVENT**

This event is open to skaters of Pre-Alpha and higher levels. Skaters are to perform **only** the three maneuvers listed below, in **ANY** order with a minimum of connecting steps. Each maneuver may only be attempted one time. **Additional maneuvers, such as any jump, spin, or gliding maneuver from a test level or any uncaptured moves are not allowed and will result in a penalty.** This event will be held on half ice for Pre-Alpha-Delta and Freestyle levels 1-3, and full ice for levels 4-10. The required maneuvers are listed below, and are the same as all 2017 ISI National Events.

Pre-Alpha	Forward Swizzles, 2 foot glide, Backward Wiggles
Alpha	Forward Stroking, Left over Right Forward Crossovers, 1 foot Snowplow Stop
Beta	Backward Stroking, Left over Right Backward Crossovers, Left T Stop
Gamma	RFI Mohawk Combination, LFI Mohawk Combination, Hockey Stop
Delta	RFI 3 Turn, LFI 3 Turn, Bunny Hop
Freestyle 1	Waltz Jump, Two foot spin, Forward Arabesque
Freestyle 2	Dance Step Sequence, 1 Foot Spin, Half Lutz Jump
Freestyle 3	Toe Loop Jump, Change Foot Spin, Dance Step Sequence
Freestyle 4	Flip jump, Sit spin, Half Loop Jump
Freestyle 5	Camel Spin, Axel jump, Back Scratch Spin
Freestyle 6	Double Salchow jump, Choice Spin: Cross Foot-Layback-Sit Change Sit Spin, Split Falling Leaf Jump
Freestyle 7	Two Walley Jumps, Flying camel spin, Double Toe Loop jump
Freestyle 8	Double Flip jump, Flying Sit Spin, Split Lutz jump
Freestyle 9	Double Lutz, Flying camel-jump-sit spin, Axel-Double Loop jump combination
Freestyle 10	Double Axel-Double Toe Loop jump combination, death drop, 3 Arabian/Butterfly jumps

ENTRY FORMS

We encourage you to enter as many events as possible! The entry forms may be found online at www.newarkicearena.com. The competition entry form should be postmarked by February 6, 2016. All checks should be made payable to the Lou & Gib Reese Ice Arena. Entry fees are not refundable.

Coach's signature must verify the entry form information; that the skater has entered at their true ability level.

CHECK-IN REGISTRATION INFORMATION

The program event schedule will be posted online at www.newarkicearena.com and emailed to the team coach at least two weeks prior to the competition. Please check with your team coach for your competition times. All competitors should register when they arrive at the competition to pick up their information packet. **Competitors should check in with ice monitors at least one hour prior to their warm up time.**

MUSIC

CD'S only will be accepted. Music should be clearly labeled with the skater's name, age and event. CD'S will be accepted with one track of music per CD. All competitors should have a backup copy of their music with them at rink side when they compete. Music should be turned in at the registration table at least one hour prior to the event.

AWARDS

ALL SKATERS WILL RECEIVE A MEDAL! Awards will be available for distribution throughout the day. Each skater in ISI competitions is a representative of a team, and will earn team points according to placement. The overall team winner will be presented a trophy at the end of the competition. Team points are awarded as follows:

First Place: 5 team points + 1 participation point

Second Place: 4 team points + 1 participation point
Third Place: 3 team points + 1 participation point
Fourth Place: 2 team points + 1 participation point
Fifth Place: 1 team point + 1 participation point
Sixth Place: 0 team point + 1 participation point

For the following ISI group events: Kaleidoskate, Pattern, Production, Synchronized Teams, and Team Compulsories, the team points are awarded as follows:

First Place: 25 points + 5 participation points
Second Place: 20 points + 5 participation points
Third Place: 15 points + 5 participation points
Fourth Place: 10 points + 5 participation points
Fifth Place: 5 points + 5 participation points

JUDGES

Each participating ISI member facility represented is asked to supply one judge per 1-10 entries. All judges must be current professional members of ISI and certified ISI judges (having passed the 2016 Update test). The ISI Judge Certification exams are available online. Listed below is a chart of judging hours that each participating facility **will be required** to supply for this ISI competition.

Number of Events entered by your students	Judging Hours Required
1-10	2 hours
11-21	4 hours
22-32	6 hours
33-44	8 hours

The Judging Request form will be available online two weeks prior to each event. Coaches should fill in their judging requests and return it to each competition director prior to the event.
